

PE and Sport Premium Spend 2019/20

The PE and Sport Premium is designed to help primary schools improve the quality of their PE lessons and sporting activities offered to each of their pupils. In 2019-20 we received £16,000, combined with an additional £10 per pupil (Years 1-6). We were therefore given a total of **£18,310**.

The coronavirus pandemic had a huge impact on our sporting calendar in the second half of the academic year. Inter-school and intra-school competitions were cancelled, and PE lessons were set via Microsoft Teams for home learning. The rest of the funding (£5,040) will be carried over to the next academic year.
