School Uniform Policy

At Tarvin Primary School we believe that it is important for children to wear uniform. School uniforms are important for a variety of reasons: They reduce competition and peer pressure among students, they help keep the focus on education as opposed to fashion choices, and they reduce clothing expenses for all parents. Uniforms also help instill a sense of school pride and tradition in students.

We encourage all children to wear the school uniform listed below.

School Uniform

- Grey tailored trousers/ shorts/ skirt/ dress
- Pale blue polo shirt (can be embroidered with school badge)
- Appropriate school footwear (not trainers or boots)
- Royal blue school sweatshirt or cardigan (can be embroidered with school badge)
- Black or grey socks
- Blue and white check dress (summer term) and white socks

P. E. Uniform

- Plain white t-shirt (can be embroidered with school badge)
- Black Shorts/ jogging bottoms/ leggings
- Trainers
- Plain royal blue or black hoodie (blue are available with school badge)

Long hair should be tied back for P.E.

It is the parent/ carer's responsibility to make sure that all clothing is marked clearly with their child's name.

Affordability

We try to ensure that our branded items are affordable, and that unbranded items are widely available. If families approach school with regards to financial difficulties, we endeavour to support with uniform.

Jewellery

Jewellery such as rings, bracelets, necklaces, should not be worn to school and if children's ears have been pierced, only stud earrings should be worn. Wrist watches are allowed but must be removed for PE. This is an essential safety precaution. Children should not wear any makeup in school.

Religious/ cultural adaptations

Any requests to the school regarding uniform adaptations based on religious or cultural grounds, would be considered with reference to our equalities policy.
